
This all reminded me of years at boarding school. This meant an 8-hour overnight train ride on the North Coast Mail – Sydney to Grafton. It's tricky trying to sleep on the overhead luggage rack. (the train was often over-crowded).

M R President, Andrew Swaine took us on a site tour afterwards. He talked enthusiastically about nuts & bolts topics and M R's plans for growth. Budget limits and ongoing maintenance seem to be endless worries. Some of the numbers he mentioned were astounding – locos weighing 80 tonnes, crane hire costing \$35,000, turntable foundations costing \$30,000 of concrete, set of loco steel tyres \$100,000. We also heard about big-league, HEAVY engineering like casting and forging. Talking heavy, concrete sleepers need 6 men to lift. For the steam loco, did you know it takes 3-4 hours to get up steam? i.e. firing the boiler with skill and care to get even heating. This all made our car repairs look like Dinky Toy stuff in comparison

There were about 12 members' cars present – all smiling and sparkling in the sunshine. My Light 15 Citroen, Monique was sad to miss out – front brakes in pieces. A pleasant afternoon mucking around on an old train. Thanks to everyone who turned up. Warwick Spinaze
