The Octogenarians



Geoff Anderson

Geoff Anderson, long time Life Club Member member has celebrated his 90 birthday recently and the Octos thought it an event worth celebrating.. "Octo Bill" interviewed Geoff many years ago and a couple of things have stuck in his memory. Geoff's profound statement when speaking of his parents "One only realizes after they have gone what good parents they were." The sign of a good son. In 1983 Geoff was sworn in at the Supreme Court as a Justice of the Peace and in 2001 was recognized by the Government with a "Certificate of Appreciation of Voluntary work".

Occasionally one hears the name "Grumpy", a name I suspect created by Charlie. It may come a bit a surprise to some but Geoff is really an old romantic. In our earlier interview he told how he and Pearl first met, confiding that "their eyes met across a crowded room" at a YMCA social in 1943 put on for the RAAF Cadets and the young evacuees from UK. Pearl returned to England after the war but Geoff and Pearl kept up a steady correspondence until the happy day arrived when she returned to Australia and in 1949 they married, surely the best event of his life. Pearl has been at his side ever since. He has retained friendships all his life, from the days in the RAAF, scuba diving mates thru to the Car Club of today.

Geoff is a collector of hurricane lamps, marine relics, and old manual water pumps., but he is a real car man, and has owned many cars. He faithfully restored a jeep, some 45 years after driving one in the RAAF. He found a gem in the form of a very low mileage Hillman which he maintained like a new car. Renowned for his skills as one of the original scuba divers, he knows Port Phillip and surrounds like the back of his hand and has investigated many sunken vessels.

Octo Mick had this little anecdote. On the Club's last visit to Point Nepean one beautifully still, sunny day, sometime in 2016, our small group, including Geoff, a former professional diver, along with Pearl, took the tourist bus to the lookout area with a view over the Gunnamatta back beach and Bass Strait beyond. Our guide remarked that this is the area where Harold Holt, then Prime Minister of Australia, entered the water and was swept away never to be seen again and, waving his hand expansively along the stretch of beach below us said, "somewhere out there, on this bit of coastline, a plaque has been attached to a rock to commemorate where he was lost"

Geoff listened to all this and then in his quiet voice said "Well actually, it is out there on a rock at the bottom of the headland to your left" the guide stared at him in disbelief and said "How do you know that is the specific spot?" Geoff replied "because I put it there". End of discussion.! Disbelief turned to admiration!

And Geoff, "just ignore Charlie!" Even he loves you like the rest of us!

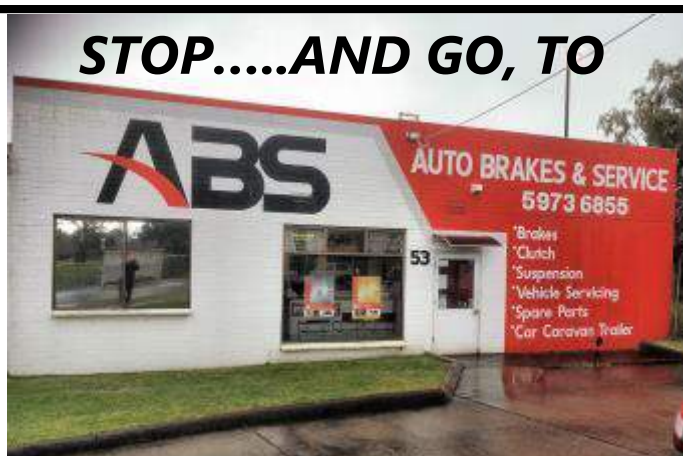
