



Paul Lucas ... a veritable volunteer

Paul was born in Dewsbury, Yorkshire where he happily spent his childhood days. Dewsbury, Paul 's birthplace, can also lay claim to being the birthplace of some very famous people.

Amongst them are Baroness Betty Boothroyd who was the first, and still the only female to hold the role of Speaker of the House of Commons and Sir Thomas Clifford Allbutt, who was a physician best known for inventing the clinical thermometer.

They both, in their own special way could really "stick it up em"

After completing school Paul got an apprenticeship with a transformer company in 1959 where he trained and qualified as a Transformer Design Draftsman. Very soon after that he spent a year in Peru on a United Nations Aid Program as a volunteer installing home lighting and electrical connections for the poor.

On his return from Peru he married Christine and in 1967 they emigrated to South Africa. It was here that Paul had a change in career to become an Automotive Paint shop Designer and Project Manager. His work took him to many countries worldwide and many different plants including Ford and General Motors.

Christine and Paul, with their three daughters, left South Africa in 1987 to come to Australia, and settled in Mornington. He retired from full time work when he was 58 years old.



About 10 years ago Paul joined the Mornington Men's Shed when at that time it had only 10 to 15 members. They started out making "Helper Towers" for Downs Syndrome youngsters to be able to help their mothers in the kitchen. He went on to build dozens of them.

Then Paul joined Solve Disability Solutions (now known as Solve-TAD following Solve's merger with TAD in 2020) as a volunteer. Solve-TAD provides personalised technology, equipment and service to help change the lives of people living with disabilities. There are now about a dozen members on the

Mornington Peninsula and they meet monthly. A visiting Occupational Therapist got them involved in many projects in the past.

Paul designed a special kayak transport trailer that allowed the remarkable Dave Jacka to make his now well documented paddle the length of the Mighty Murray River.

Paul's current project, as seen in this article, is not the first one of these that he has built as he has already completed a similar project for the Heidelberg Repatriation Hospital. He was then asked by the Royal Talbot Rehabilitation in Kew if he would undertake the design and

construction of something similar for them.

They are designed to help paraplegic and quadriplegic patients practice transferring in and out of motor cars as part of their rehabilitation.



Paul sources the vehicles from local motor wreckers and then constructs them in his garage at home. He has designed and drawn the plans and then undertakes the task of building them. The car is able to be set at different heights so that the user will be able to enter and exit all types of modern vehicles.

The car seen here is a 2000 Astra that Paul bought from a motor wrecker in Rosebud who then cut off the ends of the car using modern Laser technology.



The lifting actuators are the same as those used in

hospital beds, but for this application one at the front and one at the rear are needed.



This finished project is shown on the front cover
Being a very keen cyclist himself Paul also belongs to a
group called Freedom Wheels where his skills are used
to set up bicycles for people with disabilities. These
bikes include various features which are suitable for
independent riders and those who may need assistance.
He can also visit the rider's home to service or make any
adjustments if necessary.

During his apprenticeship with the transformer company back in the UK Paul would spend 6 months each year working in the factory learning the skills of cutting, turning and welding which he still uses in these projects.

He also learnt that you should never ask someone to build something that you designed but can't build yourself or be able to show them how.

Paul's car collection has been covered in an earlier "Crankhandle" but since then Paul and Christine have sold their very pretty Fiat 500. However, they still have the remaining members of the "Mosquito Fleet", namely "Mesha" the Messerschmitt, "Molly" the Morris Minor van, affectionately known as the "lunch box" and "Dolly" the blue and yellow Citroen 2CV.



A member of the SPC&HCC for twenty six years, and our treasurer for the past ten, Paul's solidity and commitment is appreciated by all of us in the Club and, as I am sure, by a much wider community.

### The Qantas Empire Airways Ltd Hangar Bill Glover

Construction of the Darwin hangar commenced on the 16th July 1934 for Qantas Empire Airways Ltd at Parap in the centre of Darwin. The proposed hanger was to measure 100 feet by 100 feet with a full head door clearance of 20 feet, with doors opening to allow for 4 Empire mail planes (De Havilland DH86S.) to be parked.

On each side were lean to structures running the full 100 depth. which were used as workshops storerooms and offices. It was constructed in four months at a cost of 6114 pounds (12228 dollars). It was Australia's entry point for overseas travellers (and one supposes still is)

The hangar was badly bombed by Japanese carrier borne aircraft, and one can still see bullet holes in the structure. It was repaired and used by the Allied Works Council until n 1946 when the Ross Smith aerodrome was no longer used because the RAAF constructed their present aerodrome and shared its use with civil aircraft and this situation still exists.

In 1954 the Dept. Of Civil Aviation purchased the hangar and the hangar was listed on the National Register and finally purchased by the NT Government. In 1999 The Motor Vehicles Enthusiasts club leased the hangar as their headquarters to display and work on their vehicles and projects which we visited on a recent stay in Darwin and this is the reason this article was written.

On the 14 April 1957 the English Autocar announced the arrival of the Wolseley 1500 and allocated 3 full pages to its virtues. The article disclosed to an ignorant scribe that it had the same wheelbase as the then current Morris Minor, despite having an engine almost half as big again. Like the Minor it had independent torsion bar front suspension, but an improvement with use of a set screw adjustment incorporated in the torsion arm splined to the torsion bar meant that the suspension could be lined up without the use of jacks. The Autocar writer found it handled in a very similar fashion to the Minor. The car was clothed in an attractive body and was quite roomy despite the short wheelbase.

The walnut dashboard with matching door cappings gave the interior a feeling of luxury, but it was surprising to learn that the heater unit was optional extra, as was windscreen washers and radio. Despite these shortcomings, the car was available in 24 different colour combinations including 7 two tone models. Leather was used on all wearing surfaces (again in two tone if required) and vynide on trim panels.

The car was announced at Earls Court and the cars were fitted with the latest BMC Type B engine with 8.1 compression ratio (export model) but the early Wolseley's 1500's left the factory fitted with the 7.2 ratio engine.

### From Wikipedia:

The Riley One-Point-Five and similar Wolseley 1500 are automobiles produced by Riley and Wolseley respectively from 1957 until 1965. They utilised the Morris Minor floorpan, suspension and steering but were fitted with the larger 1,489 cc (90.9 cu in) B-Series engine and MG Magnette gearbox.




