

Betty Lowe was born Betty Barclay in Glasgow, Scotland. Betty had hoped one day the Barclay Bank would ring to tell her of her connection, not to be however. Her earliest memories of motor sport, was when at six years of age her elder brother took her to an event where a skidding car threw cinders into her eyes and made her cry. She remembers the car was silver in colour and driven by someone called Stirling Moss.

Betty's Father was a bricklayer working for a London building company that had contracts in Australia to build houses in Bentleigh. Betty's Father arrived here in 1952 and a very young Betty with her Mother and Brothers arrived in 1953. Betty attended the local East Bentleigh primary School and then St Paul's in Bentleigh. Betty found employment in the rag trade as it was then called and life was good, boyfriends and particularly sports cars were her scene. Betty said "I have always loved cars" and it was at a pre Sandown car race evening at Molina's restaurant in Spring Street Melbourne that she found herself sitting next to Graeme Lowe. Graeme was a commercial pilot, solo flying twin engined aircraft out of the USA across the Pacific to customers here in Australia. He was one of the first pilots after the war to earn his wings and form the 21st reserve squadron in Melbourne. He flew in the London to Sydney air race in 1969.

Graeme and Betty were soon together with Betty becoming Graeme's business and office manager and sharing a passion of his to build an Alta 2 litre GP race car.

He began sourcing Alta engines and Chassis parts and photo's of these early Alta race cars.

The Alta Car and Engineering Company was a British sports and racing car manufacturer. The company was founded by engineer Geoffrey Taylor [1903-1966] in Surbiton, Surrey and produced it's first automobile in 1929. Alta's first vehicle was a sports car with a 1.1 litre engine cast in aluminium, wet liners and double overhead camshafts that Taylor had designed himself. It was offered as a naturally aspirated or supercharged giving 49 or 76 bhp and either a four speed non synchromesh or preselector gearboxes all mounted on a long low slung chassis with aluminium body. Thirteen

of these first models were made, of which five are thought to survive.

Later 1.1 litre and 2 litre sister cars were produced and sold steadily right up to the outbreak of the war. The engine output would power these cars to 120mph and they became popular at club races. In 1934 Taylor produced the first Alta design solely for competition, being a light weight single offset seat, these cars achieved good results in speed trials, hill climbs and time trials. Alta's keen pricing resulted in many sales. The brilliant auto engineer George Abecassis had success with his Alta car winning a string of events before the war interrupted motor sport.

Alta was the first British constructor to produce a new Grand Prix car in 1948 following the end of World War II. Although the GP car was a development of the prewar design, some 2lt engines were now developing 250 bhp with two stage supercharging.

When Betty first lived with Graeme she was a little surprised to see engine parts and Alta gearboxes housed in the wardrobe of his home. In the late 1960's a revival and rebirthing of many historic sports and race cars occurred. Barn finds of these once very desirable and historic motor cars became the activity of many at this time.

Graeme eventually found a 1930's Alta that had been


"bastardized" over many years and as he had the mechanicals the deal was done, and work commenced on this GP Alta recreation.



Graeme and Betty rented a friends property in Warrigal Road Mentone that had an eight car garage and progress on the Alta progressed at a good rate having sourced the various components from all and sundry. The six months of renting a large garage proved to be most beneficial in seeing the car nearing completion. I clearly recall at an early Sandown race meeting the impressive site and sound of this very beautiful green Alta at speed down the main straight. Graeme was a serious punter. Betty said

they took the green Alta car to all the race meetings here and interstate and were always together at these events over many years.

Graeme at 47 years of age suffered a heart attack and recovered after surgery but ended his flying career and he sold his commercial flying business with Betty staying on as office manager to the new owner for some time. The green GP Alta was eventually sold to a buyer in America. Graeme had now planned to build an Alta



sports car. They were now living in Mt Eliza with garage space and Graeme had by now ferreted most of the available Alta parts from the usual points of contact including a 1100 cc. engine at a bargain price. He found and purchased a chassis from a rubbish heap as described by Betty at the time. The Alta sports car came to fruition after some time with many hours of work and was painted glossy black.

Graeme said to Betty "this is your car now, it's for all your hard work in push starting the green GP car over the years" as the Alta typical of the day had no starter motor. Betty competed in her black supercharged Alta at every opportunity including Mallala race track in SA,





Geelong sprints, the Albert Park GP Historic Invitation Events and a number of organized rallies and Sunday breakfast drives to Flinders.

Prior to the black being finished Graeme had been told of an Alta sports car that was for sale in England. He loved building these cars and wanted to build another Alta sports with the larger 2lt supercharged engine. Betty thought to discourage Graeme in this decision but the look on Graeme's face on viewing the photo's of the car told her it was going to happen. this was to be Graeme's car. Having purchased the Alta from the UK and on it's arrival here in Australia the car was in poor condition and fell well short of the Photo's provided for It's sale. The car was garaged while the black car resoration was completed. One evening a visit from Interpol delivered the bad news. The car had been stolen by the seller in the UK. The unrestored Alta was part of a museum collection and was lent to an individual who failed to return it. It was some time later that it became apparent the car would not be returned and had been sold to Australia. Keeping a long story short, Graham had to pay the Museum for the car and having then paid twice, sought legal action against the seller in the UK who was later charged and Graeme received some of his money back some two years later. The car went under a complete rebuild by Graeme and painted red. Graeme and Betty both competed in the red car alternating the driver responsibilities year by year at Eddington Sprints. Sunday morning drives in both the black and red Alta's for breakfast at Flinders was a regular outing for them both, a most impressive site for the Flinders crowd. With Graeme's passing Betty has found good homes for the red and black Alta's. They now reside with a Melbourne family and will be well cared for.

Along with the many interesting cars Betty has owned over the years is one purchased some 15 years ago. It is a Triumph TR4A IRS Surrey Top in black that is undergoing a safety check at the home of fellow club member David Doubtfire. Betty having enjoyed many years in her Triumph is looking forward to again driving it. I look forward to having a sister car to my TR4A IRS at our club picnics and show events, well done to you Betty!



#### ANOTHER OBE AND OUR FIRST OBN AWARD


#### **ROGER HOWES**


# Christmas BBQ and Show and Shine. Tuesday 6th December




