

Mark Hillen is a very interesting person to engage with. He is bright eyed, intelligent, enthusiastic with a strong work ethic. Mark was born in Wellington New Zealand in 1953 his parents having settled there from the Netherlands

"My childhood memories are of Timaru and later Napier, of canoeing in the creek behind our home, spearing eels, shooting rats and fossicking in the dump of the timber mill for old ball races, retrieving the large roller balls, some 1" in diameter for treasure. Sailing, swimming and surfing were always part of my young life, riding our bikes everywhere including to School.

I loved to collect various volcanic rocks, skulls of animals, and lots of insects, then I would pin them to a board for display in my bedroom. I also enjoyed making things, like a basic gun using a spent .303 shell as the barrel and cutting a small slot in the shell before inserting a penny bunger with the fuse exposed through the slot, then light the fuse."

"In 1970 all the family left NZ for Australia as my father was to take up a position with Melbourne Water to improve potable water quality for Metropolitan Melbourne. His orange GT Holden Monaro with its twin stripes and orange/black houndstooth fabric seats was sadly sold. I have a brother and two sisters, all born in New Zealand. Arriving in Melbourne, the family settled in Rosanna. Having completed secondary school I followed my love of science to Latrobe University then later to Melbourne University to study and take a double major in Botany and Zoology. It was during a lecture that I suffered extreme pain to one side of my chest and I drove at great speed to Heidelberg Hospital in my VW beetle, I was desperate for a cop to pull me over to assist me to hospital. I had a collapsed lung or Spontaneous Pneumothorax as it is known. Although the lung repairs in time after medical intervention, it prevented me from having a flying career with the RAAF. I had passed the interview stage for entry and was then rejected due to my medical history. I looked at other career paths and ended up at Australia Post, firstly as a clerk then operating the Telex machine and later to Australia Post headquarters in Rathdown Street paying accounts and becoming purchasing officer in the marketing and merchandising department."

"I sold my VW beetles having driven a 1963, a 1964 and a 1969 model, they were cheap to buy.



Then with some part time work while still at University I purchased a 1967 MGB that came recommended to me due to having a recent engine rebuild. It was a great car, extremely reliable as it had to be, it was my only means of transport.

After some time working with Australia Post I purchased a



red 1966 2+2 E Type Jaguar but did not like the high roof line of this E type, I sold it and bought a Triumph TR4 Surrey Top, Dad had a Triumph TR7.



I then went off roading in a Nissan Patrol short wheel base 3.3 Diesel. High lift long travel suspension was fitted with big wheels and tested on fire tracks around Walhalla including beach and sand dunes around Robe in South Australia.



I had a bad experience while climbing a crazy steep rocky track at Walhalla, my legs turned to jelly and had to have

a mate drive my Nissan Patrol out of the track. I had previously noticed a rolled 4WD off this track that did not end well for the driver. I began to question why I was doing this crazy stuff.

"In 1984 Dad took a retirement package from Melbourne Water and together we discussed purchasing a business of some kind. We looked at Hotels, Motels, Dry Cleaners, Newsagents and Chicken Farming for the poultry industry. I knew a little about chicken farming by visiting a farm in the worst conditions of heat and cold to access the down side of the industry.

The first farm we looked at was in Truemans Rd and was the one we purchased a year later. We moved from the 5 acres in Lower Plenty where we were then living to the 15 acres in Truemans Rd Rosebud. The poultry farm could carry 78,000 birds in the existing 5 sheds that were constructed in the 1960's of timber and asbestos. These were replaced in time with 3 large sheds having concrete floors and clear span insulated walls. I had tractors and a Toyota Landcruiser tipper truck to remove spent litter from the sheds that I then sold on to backyard gardeners and landscapers. I worked the sheds myself and could only have time off when the sheds were free of birds, the farm was sold in the 2000."

"I was offered a job to operate another chicken farm but preferred to do my own thing. I set about offering my services to other growers to clean out spent litter from their shed floors as is required between batches of birds. usually at 35 to 50 day intervals. The Mornington Peninsula is sand based and there is a real need for manure to enhance soils for market gardens and landscapers. I owned the necessary machines with their custom made scrapers and buckets to clean the sheds. I stock piled and delivered the manure by tip truck to various market gardens including bagging for private purchase. Some years later I purchased a chicken farm in Moorooduc. I had a mate help me rebuild the old steel framed sheds, in all talking 3+ years to transform by taking each shed out of production while removing Asbestos cladding and rebuilding each as modern shed tunnels with evaporative cooling pads. Each shed took over a year to rebuild. I lived at the farm and operated it for 12 years before I sold it in March 2022."

While Mark was busy with work, his car interest continued with the purchase in 1985 of his current 1967 E type Jaguar convertible. [with removable hardtop.] The E type was based on the D type that won Le Mans in three consecutive years. The E type had for that time a novel design in that the subframe carrying the engine



and front suspension was bolted directly to the body tub. The early cars weighed only 1,315 kg and had a top speed of 150 mph. E types have good access to the mechanicals and Mark removed the engine and gear box for rebuilding only to have to remove the engine and gearbox again to correct some rather poor work within the gearbox by others at some past point in time. His current collection includes a Holden HSV GTS VP built in 1992, and a 2008 4.2 litre `supercharged 420 bhp Jaguar XKR that is beautiful and built by Ford at the same time as the DB7 Aston Martin that shared the same floor pan and other components, they are very pretty and well built cars. His shed also houses his tractors, everyday cars and a Trimaran Yacht that he enjoys to sail when time permits.

Since secondary school Mark has had an interest in radio controlled powered model aircraft that he still flies today at the local aero club. He has numerous models powered by a variety of engine designs running on methanol fuel mixtures. In this photo below is an aerobatic Pitts Special with Mark holding a radial engine so beautifully made like a clock movement.



He is currently into gliders and throws them from cliff tops here on the Southern Peninsula, they glide in the thermals like a bird and stay aloft, until signaled back using radio control.

Mark's love of the sciences continues with a large collection of telescopes through which he can see the gas flows around Jupiter and comets travelling through the galaxies. In the shadows of the half moon the topography of mountains and craters is one of his favorite viewings. In his collection is a reflector scope having a lens of 12.5 inches diam. He searches the internet to purchase these scopes and carries out any repairs or modifications as required to return them to good working order. He has a top end manufactured microscope that he uses to see a collection of insects [and splinters] in great detail and satisfying his continued interest in Botany and Zoology. It will be interesting to hear of Mark's next project, he has a very strong work ethic and a busy mind, well done to you Mark.


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Minutes Summary SPC&HCC General Meeting Tuesday 2nd May 2023



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
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
